

Faculty Professional Development

Georgia Tech provides faculty with many development opportunities in support of the institute's mission of superior teaching and instruction. All new instructors of record at the institution receive a teaching orientation. Continued support is provided by Georgia Tech's [Center for Teaching and Learning](#) supports faculty development by offering workshops, learning communities, teaching retreats, as well as recognizing faculty through fellowships and teaching awards. The [Center for 21st Century Universities \(C21U\)](#) is Georgia Tech's living laboratory for fundamental change in education, by working in tandem with campus administrators and faculty to identify, develop, and test new educational platforms and methodologies.

The Office of the Vice Provost for Graduate Education and Faculty Development (VP GEFD) supports professional development opportunities for faculty beyond teaching by concentrating on topics like new faculty orientation, leadership, mentoring, and project management. The goal is to support the productivity, professional flourishing, deep engagement in cross-disciplinary community and collaboration, and holistic well-being of diverse Institute faculty.
